We recommend to select each semester <u>one</u> of our Modules or courses from one semester in the same degree programme.

Subjects offered in the 1^{st} , 3^{rd} and 5^{th} semester can only be chosen in the **Winter Term**. Subjects offered in the 2^{nd} , 4^{th} and 6^{th} semester can only be chosen in the **Summer Term**.

International students wishing to take subjects from the **masters programmes** must have sufficient knowledge of the respective subjects, as all of these courses are at an advanced level.

Language of instruction:

The principal language of instruction in all degree programmes is **German**. All incoming students attending courses taught in German need to have sufficient language skills that enable them to attend classes in German and sit examinations (**minimum requirement: level B1** according to the <u>Common European Framework of Reference for Languages</u>).

Courses in English:

EPS – European Project Semester:

EPS at St. Pölten UAS is embedded in the Department of Media & Digital Technologies and focuses on **Media Technology** and **Media Production**. The projects are carried out in co-operation with technology and the creative industries.

Accommodation:	Student hostels: There are three student hostels within walking distance of St. Pölten UAS: 'Campus Domus', 'Wihast' and 'Campus Villa'. Students who wish to live in 'Campus Domus' or 'Wihast' are asked to fill in the application form, tick the appropriate boxes and send in the form by the deadlines mentioned above (see 'Application deadlines for international students').



	Private accommodation: Private rooms and flats/flatshares often appear on the market at short notice. Vacancies and flatshare offers are posted on the university noticeboards. St. Pölten UAS does not let any rooms to students. We can only give you support in finding a room. Students will have to get in touch with the landlords/landladies themselves. Students living in a student hostel will sign the contract with the student hostel itself, not with St. Pölten UAS.
