STUDENT OBLIGATIONS AND EXAMS

Requirements for completed course:

Requirements for completing the course ENGLISH LANGUAGE 2:

1. **Attendance:** attending the lectures at least 8 times
2. **Written exam:** Students can take a written **final exam** (70 points, 60% needed to pass the exam) or a **mid-term and end-term exam** (35 points each, 60% needed to pass each exam, points are added and the final grade is given according to the following grade scale: 42-48=2, 49-55=3, 56-62=4, 62-70=5).
3. **Oral exam:** The oral exam involves students choosing a course topic and independently expanding it from additional sources. By presenting their own attitudes, conclusions and reasoning the students demonstrate the mastery of the course topics and grammar structures covered during the course.

METHODOLOGY OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COURSE PLAN

1. LECTURES

Topics are introduced through a short discussion. After introducing the key terms, the text is read out loud and analysed. Individual grammar units are practised through exercises which students solve independently, in groups or in pairs.

2 AUDITORIAL EXERCISES

Auditory exercises are carried out with students demonstrating the understanding of the topics by doing exercises in groups, pairs or individually. The understanding of the grammatical structures covered in the lesson is evaluated through short oral examinations. The students are encouraged to develop all four language skills: listening, reading, speaking and writing.





3 DOCUMENTATION

Records are kept of the attendance at the lectures, exercises, and exams and the results of mid-term and end-term tests, and final exams.

4 SCORING SYSTEM

Students master the course materials through lectures, discussions, and independent work. If the course requirements are met, they will be given 1 ECTS credit.
